

Copland King. 4th Oct 1896. 31 16
In ARMMU 18th Dec 1896.

"We then visited various districts belonging to the large
Marina (or) tribe. The principal settlement is Viaka (sic) and
there, between that village & Jandiga, I hope to establish a
station for native teachers. The population in immediate
connection with it would be about 500. The people both
here and at the other chief settlement received me much
more quietly than last year, but they still need a considerable
amount of training in matters concerning meum & laum, to say
nothing of the necessity of curbing their fighting propensities. This
last named district is marked on the charts as Makimaki. Last
year I called it ARABANON, but Wanigela seems to be the
correct name."

Notes of a trip to Collingwood Bay by Rev Copland King M.A., &
Mr. EH Clark. (ARMMU 18 Dec 1896) — long article

"On our way across the Bay we were met by a canoe
from Viaka, some 4 miles further on the coast line. On it came,
alongside the canoe we were in, and contained some 10 or 12 natives — men —
and their chief, Wanigela. This man is worthy of more than passing
notice, for he has great influence over his people, and, I think, will be a
friend to our mission. He is tall, well built, & well formed features,
that is, when his face ... (u. long article) — it get ps. if possible.
