

July 18, 1907 - following instructions of H. Newton, specimens  
of women's work sent off - charged to Bishop's Curio  
Account: 18 types of pottery, 5 twine, 8 netted  
bags, 8 mourning ornaments, 14 topka = 15/-  
Sept. 6 - Chignell arrives, Moore dies.

17 Sept. 1907 (Stamped) "Mr. Money has handed the logs over to me  
this day. Let my first entry be a record of the sheer surprise  
(soon replaced by great thankfulness) with which, on my first  
visit to Collingwood Bay, I saw the outward signs of  
what has been accomplished at Wanigera ~~at~~ Uiahu.  
Although priest-in-charge of the district, & nominally  
& actually the responsible head of affairs & although  
Mr. Money at once & very truly offered to place under my  
immediate superintendence the whole, & as much of the  
actual guidance of things as I wished to undertake,  
— I desire, in the first place, to put on record my  
sense of complete confidence in Mr. Money's knowledge  
& ability & powers of management as regards the working  
of these stations — & then to add that though I am  
ready & willing to accept the full burden of my  
responsibility that may ~~well~~ rightly be laid upon me  
from time to time — yet I trust that for a long while to  
come Mr. Money ~~and~~ I shall work together here, ~~and~~  
& that my part in the daily routine (apart, ~~from~~ of  
course, from the discharge of special ministerial  
duties) may be merely that of a beginner who is well  
disposed to accept the guidance & counsel of an  
experienced & successful colleague, & who hopes that  
he is "neither so young as to be omniscient, nor  
so old as to be unteachable."

released.

June 4 1908 Mr JP Hennelly — acting R.M.

June 19-5 — away on trip to interior with R.M., inland  
from Uiahu — map included

Sept & Oct Reuben — May — Rosef show → see Out Post

- Oct. 5 Reuben and Mary married
- Oct. 9 - The part that didn't get recorded  
 Reuben visited AKC in hysterical condition, soon followed by Mary, who was refusing to eat anything & threatening to die  
 - AKC saw it as a case "of exaggerated sexual excitement, with which (in Reuben's case) a good deal of "religious" excitement was mingled. He treated them with Ammonium Bromide, & kept Reuben hard at work for the rest of the day,..." - blew over
- Oct. 17th - visited from Mrs. DENNIS & BLAXLAND of the Colonial Sugar Refining Company for some samples.

- July 2 - Attack on ONTOS by Dviri - BABAKO of AIERAM and SEMISAK killed (lost a boy).  
 - 4 - Chignell and Money said to be engaged in translating "for some time"
- July 21st - long list of people confirmed by the Bishop
- Oct. 30 - Tomkinson married Ambrose Parra & Vivian UORO
- Aug 4 - Chignell leaves (on leave?)  
 [some gaps here] Aug. 19 - Money leaves. - rest entry by Tomkinson

1911

- July 6 - Mr Hunt in charge until Chignell returns
- July 8th - Dviri scare - Hunt reports similar incident to that in Chignell's book - false alarm
- July 27th - something about the New Moon being celebrated by children with dancing & shouting
- Aug 3 - Report that Peter had been fined £3 at Tufi for firing upon and breaking Akaira canoes - these people had speared one of the cattle & P. took the law into his own hands - his gun taken away  
 - Hunt apparently working on Makawansese

Aug. 14th - AKE back with Misses Winterbottom & Nurse Pottigan  
Aug 27th - notes that the Celebration done in Wedauan at the request of the Wanigera people who said "that the better-known Wedauan Eucharist was more desirable than the unfamiliar Ubi." & List of children at Giu

Sept. 1 - List of boarders.

Sept. 8 - Note on Uiahu - station in great disrepair, no boarders for more than a year; church not safe because of white ants.  
- Ambrose and Benjamin still there; Chignell to take in Uiahu boarders at Wanigela

- 9th - Miss WINTERBOTTOM begins teaching

- 10th - drops that there are plans for a "hospital"

\*Oct. 4 - Names added to school roll include KAMIT, son of COOKIE-HOUSE (sic) of ORERESAN.

Oct. 13-14 Ambrose and Vinian have baby boy - dies - buried on ~~old~~ site of the new church at Uiahu.

Nov. 8 - Mission station on Nanin Is. being considered by AKEC and Strong

Nov. 20 - Uiahu boarders: SIKO, INONI, FAUNA, GABADÏ (sic), TAIMU, BERNA, KIMANU, DOBURU, PASSI, FOYA, BABI, KAVEKA - apparently staying with Ambrose, but not care.

Dec. 9th - Mr. HUGHES, ARM

Dec. 10. "The services today were well attended, except by women & elder girls, many of whom have gone away to the gardens, fearing a general examination before the A.R.M. for venereal disease. Many cases have been collected, of late, from the MAISIN villages, but it has not been found here, except in the case of SOBO (who is now detained at TUFÏ) & KAINORA."

Dec. 15 - Mosquitos bad for a fortnight, rendering day

Dec. 17 - Class begun for 12 MAISIN brought up by Ambrose, who have been attending Giu for 15 years:

Boys: DOBURU, KAPARU, RIRI, GOMARA, MADARA, BERUAPI, PAUNA, GABADI, KIMANU

Girls: DUPU, KOSIRA, AMBU
