1914

Marua asking for a teacher.

Ambrose "is, perhaps, the best educated of our S.S.T. teachers, but he is much too quiet and gentle for such turbulent people as the Maasin."

1915 &amp; 1916, nothing of interest "1917

1918 Ureku Jennings from June 27 &amp; Ureku a district of its own

- district has 190 Christians

- comment on how well Jennings is doing with language considering how hard it is.

1919 New church dedicated

- lonely place - good for a layman

- HC now always celebrated in Maasin

1920 Jennings about to take charge of Merapi's home with him, 245 Christians

- End of AR's.

1943 Uiahu 3 inf bap.; Sinapa - 12/14, 3 inf., 9 masses,

1944 Uiahu 10 inf 4 adult bap., Sinapa 1 inf.

1945 Uiahu 11 inf 22 adults Sinapa 12 inf.

- records on Uiahu apparently lost. Almost nothing on  
schools although they did go on.
