 pp.41-2 of Missionary Notes of 27 June 1902.

Some ***** of his correspondence is held by The

* My notes say that the Index card for this states:-

Money, Percy J. Photos, Collingwood Bay 1900-10

I think the cover is inscribed "Photographs taken in Collingwood
Bay, N.E. Coast, Papua (1900-1910)."

An inscription inside says: "Photographs taken by me in Collingwood
Bay N.E. Coast Papua, illustrative of
native life and customs. (1900-1910)
Percy J. Money.
Nov. 12th 1910."

My impression is that these photographs are different to those in
"An Outpost in Papua".

If my memory serves me correctly, Mitchell acquired this Album
through Tyrrells in George St., not direct (this has interesting
implications).

** Presumably another Album - some duplication is present.

*** By my reckoning, the 1911 (Smith, Elder & Co., London) edition of
this book contains 45 photographs by Money. The 1915 reprint (same
publishers) contains no photos at all, while that from John Murray
in 1925 contains only a few.

**** No information on Chignell's other book (1913), or on books such
as Newton, 1914.

***** Scope unknown (possibly in connection with the more than 1,000
artefacts which he collected and which they hold (see p.51, Pacific
Islands Monthly, May 1976)).
